

#### DIY Abortion: A Brave New World

"She doesn't want to leave her house." The words struck me as I was reminded once again of what we are up against. I was on a monthly review call with the agency we use to market to abortion-determined women. As we studied what women are searching, the top searches leading them to make a call to schedule with us are "abortion services" and "abortion pill."

Even with *Roe v. Wade* overturned, abortion is still available in about 75% of the country. Organizations like Planned Parenthood are working harder than ever, focusing specifically on expanding access to the abortion pill. They know the client and how to reach her because their business depends on it! Because the FDA has made the abortion pill easy to obtain, women often do not even have to go to a clinic. We recently saw one young woman who was waiting for her mail-order abortion pills to arrive from Europe.

Further research made me stumble upon the resource from where she had ordered her pills. For only **\$105**, the pills could be shipped here to Kentucky, thus ending the life of her baby with very little, if any, medical supervision.

#### Mail order abortion pills and DIY abortions are here. She doesn't even have to leave her house.

Because so many women are seeking abortion pills to end their pregnancy, we know it is an area where we at PHC must be educated and have options available. As we look ahead, we are hoping to begin offering **telehealth** services to build relationships with women BEFORE they come in. In addition, a service we are prayerfully looking to offer is **Abortion Pill Reversal**. This can be done if the woman has only consumed the first medication and is about **50% effective** in saving the life of the baby. Our nurses will be attending a training in April to learn more.

I plead with you not to rest in the fact that abortions are (currently) illegal in Kentucky. Women are still seeking abortions. Women are still in crisis. We need your partnership to be able to continue to reach them and to offer the help and hope they so desperately need, so that they are empowered to **CHOOSE LIFE!**

More than half of abortions are obtained through the abortion pill.

## WHAT IS THE ABORTION PILL?

The abortion pill can be taken up to 10 weeks gestation. Ending a pregnancy with an abortion pill involves taking two medications. Mifepristone stops the pregnancy from growing. Misoprostol is taken up to 48 hours later, causing cramping and bleeding, expelling the baby from the uterus.

# Reflection on the Day of Life Celebration

PHC hosted the Day of Life event on January 22, the 50th anniversary of the *Roe v. Wade* decision. Community members gathered on the lawn of the Madison County Courthouse to pray for our community, state, and nation. Congressman Andy Barr and Kentucky Right to Life Association President Addia Wuchner were in attendance and gave state and national updates regarding the sanctity of life, encouraging attendees to keep fighting on behalf of the unborn. Local community leaders, legislators, and pastors also spoke and prayed.



# Abortions remain illegal in Kentucky

In a much-anticipated decision, the Kentucky Supreme Court ruled on February 16 that a lower court wrongfully stopped the enforcement of the state's two laws that protect the unborn. This decision allows for abortion to remain illegal in Kentucky, resulting in between 2000-3000 abortions that would have typically occurred to no longer be happening in the state.

Justice Debra Hembree Lambert asserted in her opinion that the circuit court "abused its discretion by granting abortion provider's motion for a temporary injunction."

"Since the U.S. Supreme Court overruled Roe v. Wade last June, we have vigorously defended Kentucky's Human Life Protection Act and Heartbeat Law," Attorney General Daniel Cameron said in a statement. "We are very pleased that Kentucky's high court has allowed these laws to remain in effect while the case proceeds in circuit court."
